1. Background

Integrated Service for Displaced Population (ISDP) is a humanitarian and development organization established in 2010 in Puntland State of Somalia. ISDP is committed to serving vulnerable populations including women, children, and internally displaced communities. With 65% of staff being women, ISDP is founded on principles of gender inclusion, equitable participation, community-led programming, and accountability.

Vision

A society with improved living conditions and equal opportunities for all poverty, injustice and all forms of violence against women girls are eliminated.

Mission

Committed to improving living conditions and advancing gender equality in partnership with communities to build sustainable, healthy, and productive communities in Somalia, free from violence and discrimination against women and girls.

Malaria remains one of the major public health challenges in Somalia, particularly in Bossaso, where seasonal outbreaks continue to affect high-risk groups such as pregnant women and children under five. To support malaria prevention efforts and improve LLINs (Long-Lasting Insecticide-Treated Nets) coverage, ISDP will conduct a mass household-level distribution campaign in Bossaso District using DHIS2 Tracker and Last Mile Supply Management (LMSM) systems.

2. Purpose of the Assignment



ISDP is seeking qualified Community Distributors and Social Mobilizers to support the LLINs distribution campaign. The teams will conduct house-to-house distribution, digital household registration, social mobilization, and community awareness activities. The Community Distributors and Social Mobilizers will play a critical frontline role in ensuring that households receive the correct number of mosquito nets, understand how to use and care for them properly, and are encouraged to adopt safe and consistent malaria prevention practices.

This assignment aims to:

- Ensure equitable and complete household coverage during the LLINs distribution through **house-to-house data collection and verification**.
- Support the use of digital data collection systems (DHIS2 Tracker) to promote accurate, real-time beneficiary registration and reporting.
- Strengthen community awareness and behavior change regarding malaria transmission and prevention, particularly among pregnant women, caregivers, and households with young children.
- Promote trust and cooperation between community members and health actors through respectful engagement and effective communication.
- Contribute to the overall goal of reducing the malaria burden by ensuring that distributed LLINs are used correctly and consistently at the household level.

3. Key Responsibilities

A. Community Distributors

- Conduct house-to-house LLINs distribution in assigned areas.
- Register households and enter data using DHIS2 Tracker (mobile-based).
- Verify household details and ensure nets are issued according to standard allocation.
- Maintain proper records and accountability for LLINs stock.
- Report daily progress and challenges to the Supervisor.

B. Social Mobilizers

- Conduct community awareness and mobilization activities on malaria prevention.
- Provide behavior change messages on correct LLIN usage, hanging, and care.
- Work with IDP leaders, women groups, and elders to mobilize households.
- Support distributors where needed to ensure full household coverage.
- Report daily awareness and mobilization outcomes to Supervisor.

Preferred Education	Diploma in Public Health, Community Development, Nursing, Social Work, or related field.
Experience	Previous experience in community mobilization, health campaigns, data collection, or humanitarian projects is an advantage.
Skills	Ability to communicate clearly, work respectfully with communities, and follow instructions.
Technical	Ability to use smartphones/tablets for data entry. Experience with DHIS2 is an added advantage.
Language	Fluency in Somali Basic English is a plus.

- Strong commitment to beneficiary dignity and accountability.
- Ability to work respectfully with IDP and host communities.
- Candidates with previous experience in LLIN campaigns within Bossaso district, community health volunteers, and health facility volunteers will be **strongly considered**.

 - PSEA (Protection from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse) Policy
 - Data confidentiality and reporting standards.
